

Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and the top Palestinian official have agreed on a plan to relaunch long-stalled Israeli-Palestinian peace talks, while the US said Thursday that Secretary of State John Kerry would soon travel to the region to work towards an Israeli-Palestinian peace agreement. "After intensive talks, we have an agreement that will lead to resuming negotiations," Netanyahu told reporters. "We agreed to resume negotiations... the details will be discussed in the coming days," he said, after meeting Palestinian leader Mahmoud Abbas in Jerusalem. Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas said in a statement that Israel had "responded positively" to the Palestinians' proposals. "As a result of the negotiations, I will be meeting with the prime minister next week," he said. Kerry was due to speak with Netanyahu and Abbas during his first trip to the region since becoming secretary of state earlier this week. "This is an historic day. I am confident that the parties will move forward in the days ahead to explore opportunities to achieve the goal of two states living side by side in peace and security," Kerry said in a statement. However, Abbas was expected to reject Kerry's offer and take Israel to the International Criminal Court over its settlement building on occupied Palestinian land, his spokesman said. "We will not accept anything that is not connected to the 1967 borders, and we will not accept anything that would weaken our national rights," the spokesman said. Netanyahu and Abbas have agreed to restart negotiations after a two-year hiatus, as Israel grapples with a diplomatic crisis over the increasingly thorny issue of settlements on occupied land in the West Bank. "Israel has responded positively to the Palestinian invitation to resume direct negotiations," the US State Department said in a statement. The announcement comes after Netanyahu announced in a speech on Wednesday that his cabinet was prepared to adopt a plan for land swaps that would, among other things, allow the return of land captured by Israel in the 1967 82157476af
